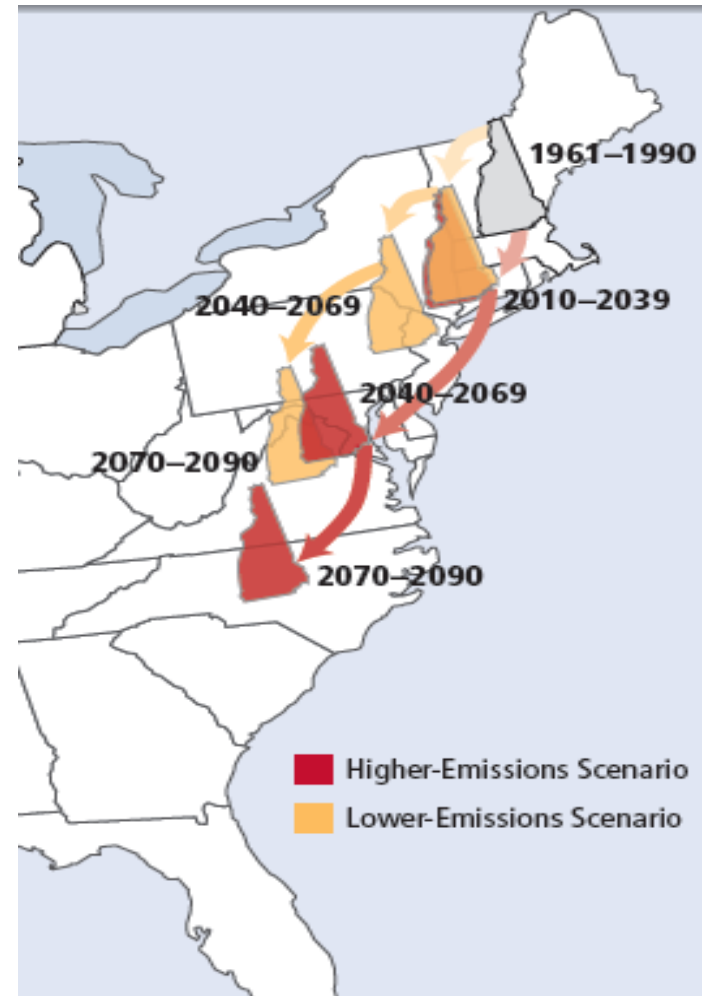


- **Climate Mitigation** – Reduction of GHG emissions
- **Climate Adaptation** – Reduces impacts/capitalizes opportunities

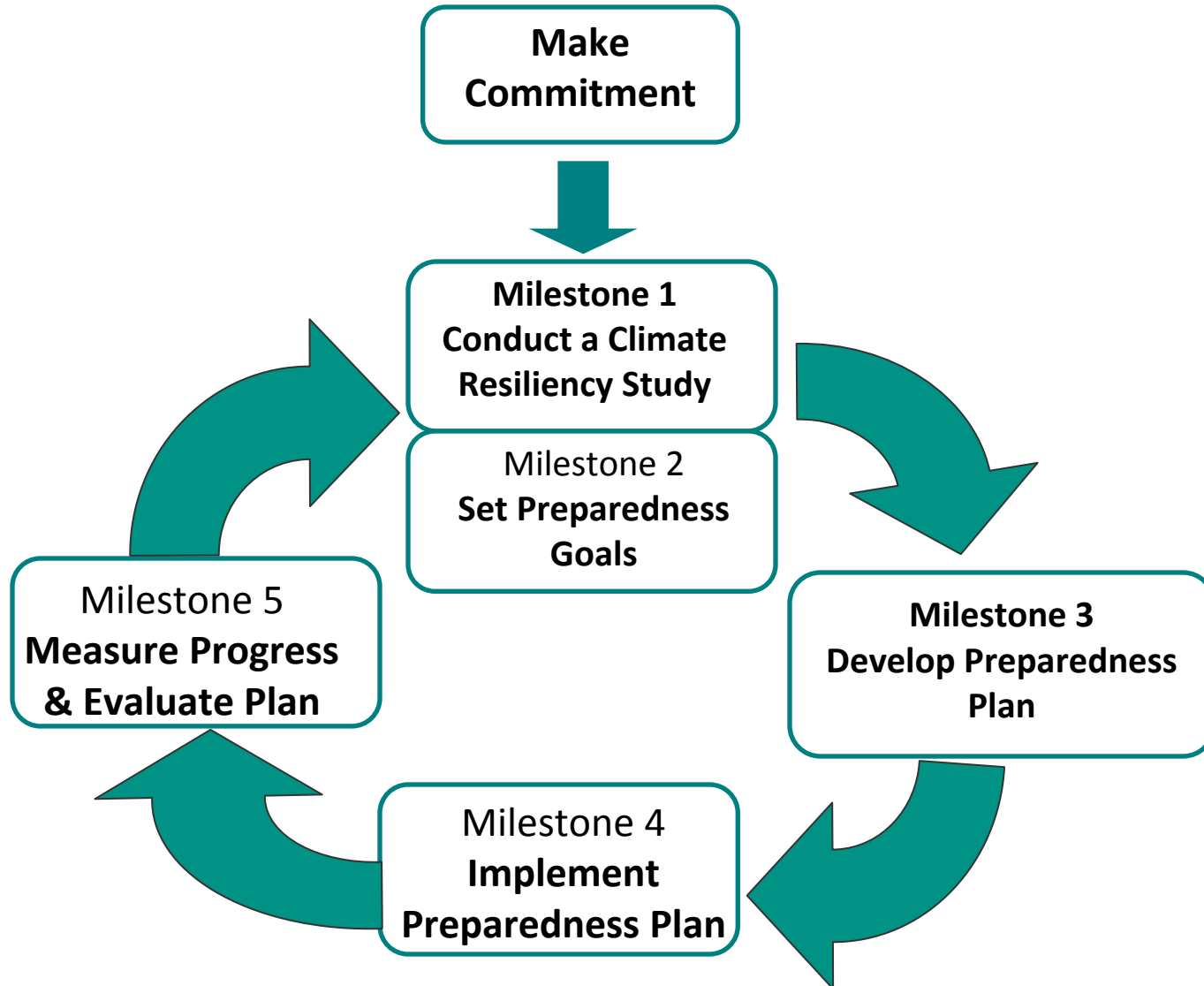
Adaptation and Mitigation are not mutually exclusive!

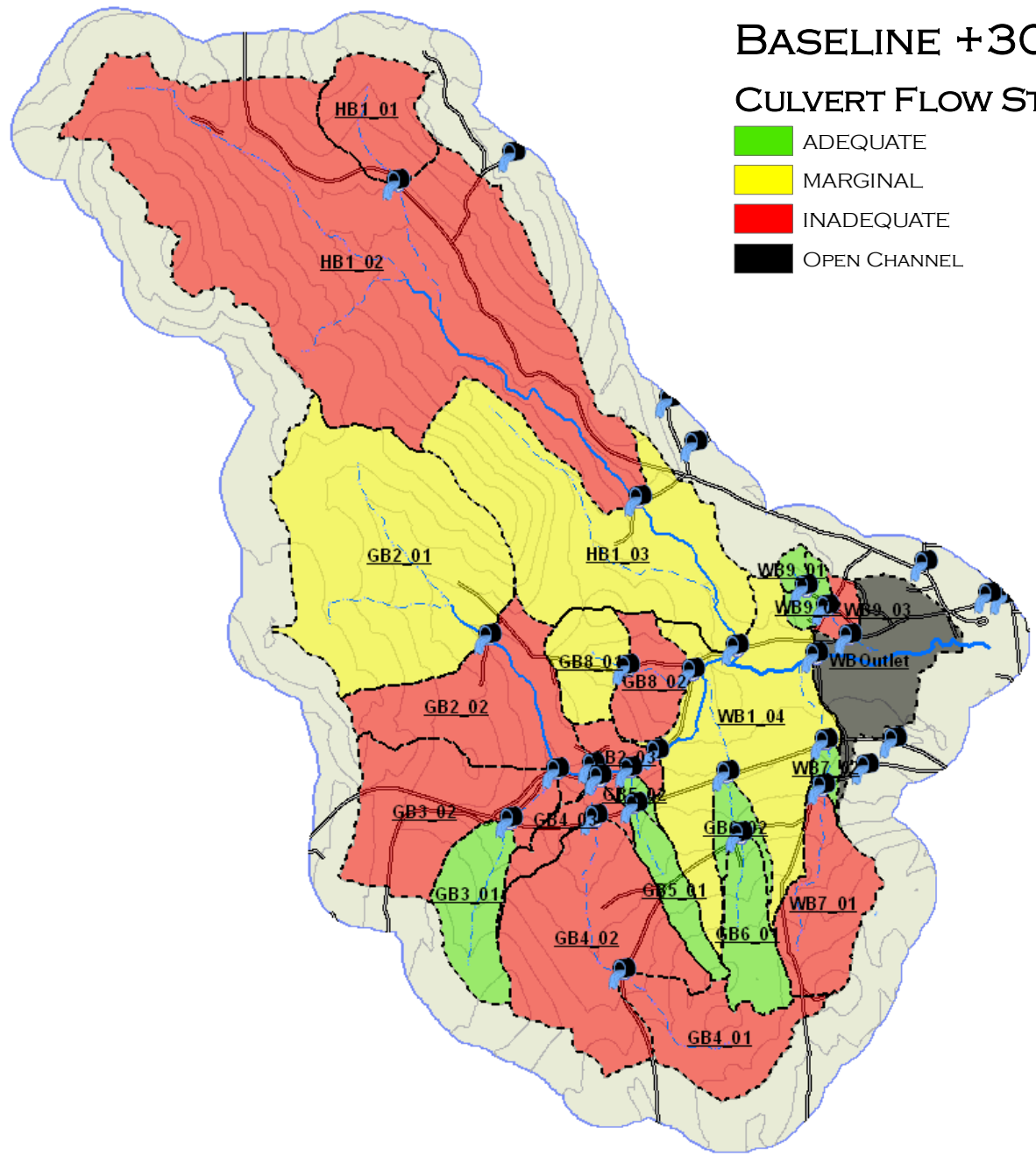

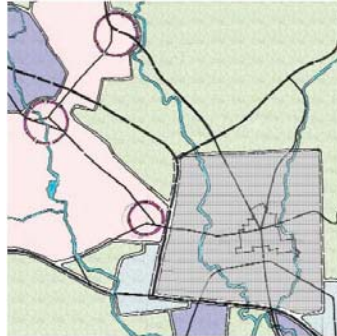

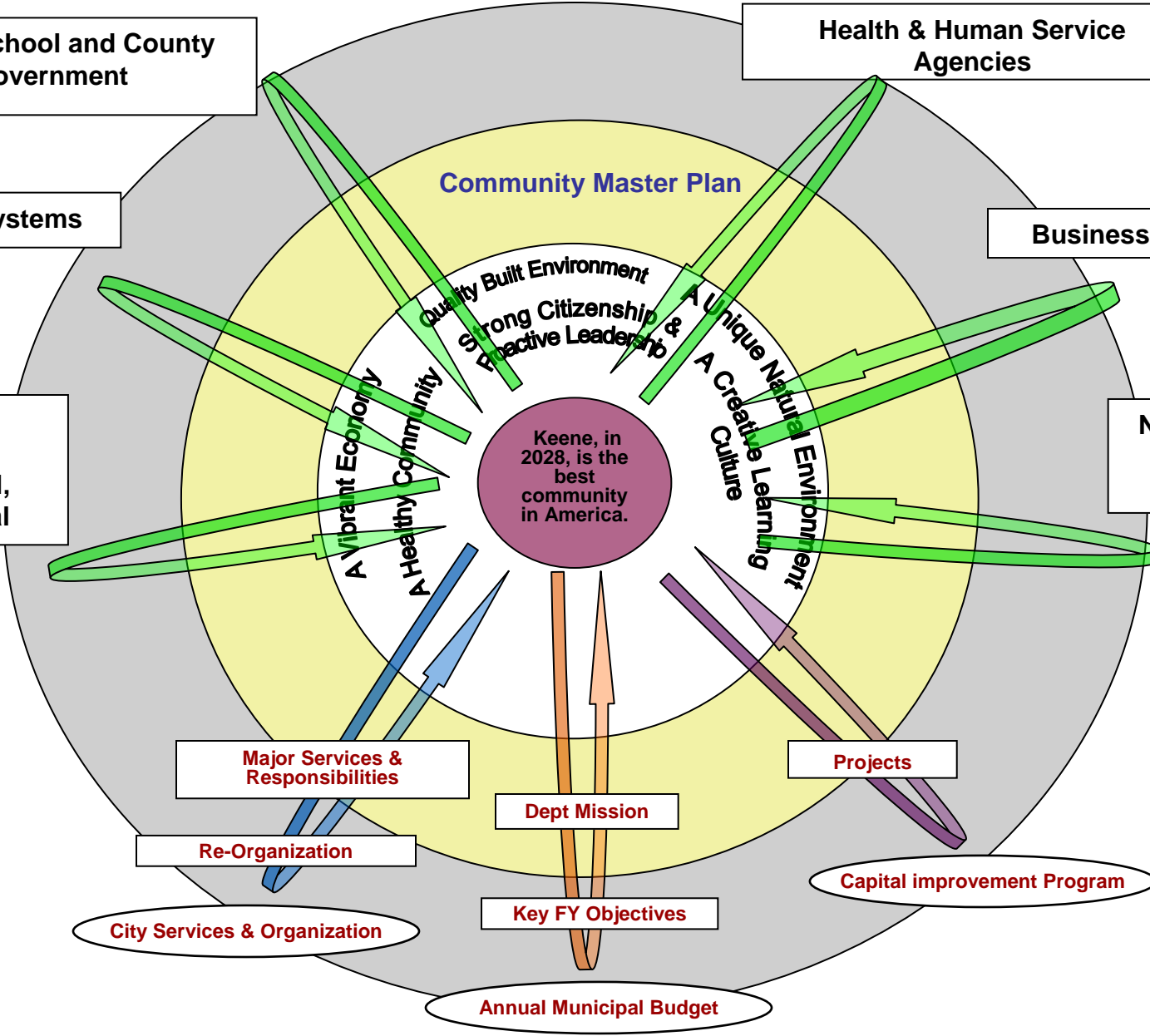
